

Things to do, before we say "I do"

## Quick, quick, quick!

[ Set a provisional date for your wedding and check with "important" guests that they have no other fixed engagements.	•
Think about hiring a wedding co-ordinator.	
Decide on the type of ceremony you want i.e. religious or civil.	
Decide who is going to pay for your wedding and agree a budget.	
Write down a provisional guest list for the ceremony, day and evening receptions.	
Choose your wedding stationery and place your order.	
Provisionally book your venues.	
Arrange wedding insurance cover before paying any deposits etc.	
Decide on the type of catering you would like.	
Book your photographer/videographer.	
Decide on the type of music and entertainment for your ceremony and reception.	
Order your wedding cake.	
Book all of your wedding transportation	
Start shopping for your dress and try on as many styles as possible.	
Eight Months to go	
Send out your Save the date invitations	
Choose your bridesmaids dresses and think about their shoes and accessories.	
Choose outfits for the groom, best man, ushers, pageboys, ring bearer.	
Discuss outfits with both mothers and decide on the colour and style of corsage they want.	
Choose the style of flowers you want and book with a florist. Discuss bouquets, posies, button-hole venue and ceremony displays, table centres and gifts for mums.	S,
Choose and order your wedding rings.	
Finalise your wedding cake.	
Start a routine to get your skin, hair and nails looking good.	
Book your hairstylist.	
Book your make-up artist.	
Organise and book your honeymoon, don't forget to check your passport expiry dates.	



## Six Months to go... Send out your Wedding Invitations for the day and evening. Order the remaining items of your wedding stationery e.g. order of service, menus, table plan, place cards and thank-you cards. Remember to obtain your minister or registrar's final approval for your order of service before going to print! Choose your Honeymoon outfits. Put together a list of telephone numbers for ALL of your wedding contacts. Two Months to go... Check that the Best Man and Chief Bridesmaid have arranged stag and hen parties. Look into buying a guest book for people to sign on the day, or fingerprint card. Organise a trial run with your hairstylist including your bridesmaids. Organise a trial run with your make-up artist, again including your bridesmaids. Chase guests who have not responded to your wedding invitation. Start a relaxation regime as things will get quite hectic about now. One Month to go... Book final hair appointments (earlier if you know that your hairdresser is very busy), and your make-up artist if you are having one. Confirm whether you will be going to the salon on the day or having stylists to your home. Send your final numbers to the caterer and the reception venue. Check that the transport details are finalised. Choose and buy presents for attendants, family and friends. Finalise your reception table plans and perhaps come up with alternative ways to name your tables. One to Two weeks to go... Organise the final rehearsal at the venue for the ceremony. Try to wear-in your wedding shoes. Make sure your order of service sheets, menus, place cards and thank-you cards have been delivered.
